

Redevelopment of Avenue des Pins

Between Rue Saint-Denis and Boulevard Saint-Laurent

Hello,

Major redevelopment work will be carried out soon on Avenue des Pins, between Rue Saint-Denis and Boulevard Saint-Laurent. The work will begin in July 2021 and end in November 2022. A second phase, between Boulevard Saint-Laurent and Avenue du Parc, will begin in 2022.

The presence of work teams at the site will depend on the progress of the work. The interventions include repairing the underground infrastructures, rebuilding the sidewalks, constructing protected bike paths, adding trees and rest areas and replacing the street lighting and traffic lights.

The upgrades will help showcase the street's institutional, cultural and landscape heritage. When they are complete, residents and merchants will be able to enjoy a safe, user-friendly, green street.

More efficient infrastructures

Some of the underground infrastructures date back to the 19th century and have come to their end of their useful life. Repairs cannot be postponed.

We plan to take this opportunity to make this artery safer and friendlier for all users, especially pedestrians and cyclists.

The project will:

- Upgrade the underground infrastructures
- Enhance the safety and comfort of pedestrians and cyclists
- Add greenery
- Showcase the buildings of interest along the avenue, such as the Hôtel-Dieu's Musée des Hospitalières and the Musée des Fusiliers Mont-Royal
- Consolidate the avenue's role as an access route to Mont-Royal



This work will provide you with more efficient municipal infrastructure and safe, high-quality roads. The city does not foresee any other major interventions in the area for the next 20 years, other than usual maintenance work.

Before the work starts, you will receive a notice informing you of the upcoming work and its impacts on traffic, access to sidewalks and buildings, garbage and recycling collection, street parking, public transit and so on.

The entire project team is aware that this work may cause some inconvenience, especially if you are home more often during the day because of the pandemic. We will strive to reduce the impacts as much as possible and we thank you for your patience and cooperation.

REPLACEMENT OF LEAD SERVICE ENTRIES IN THE WORK AREA ONLY

A drinking water service line comprises two portions: a public portion and a private portion. During the work, the city will replace the public portion for which it is responsible and the private portion if it is made of lead. If the private portion of the water service line is made of lead, the city's new by-law 20-030 makes its replacement mandatory. Affected property owners will be notified and will be contacted by the contractor as required.
