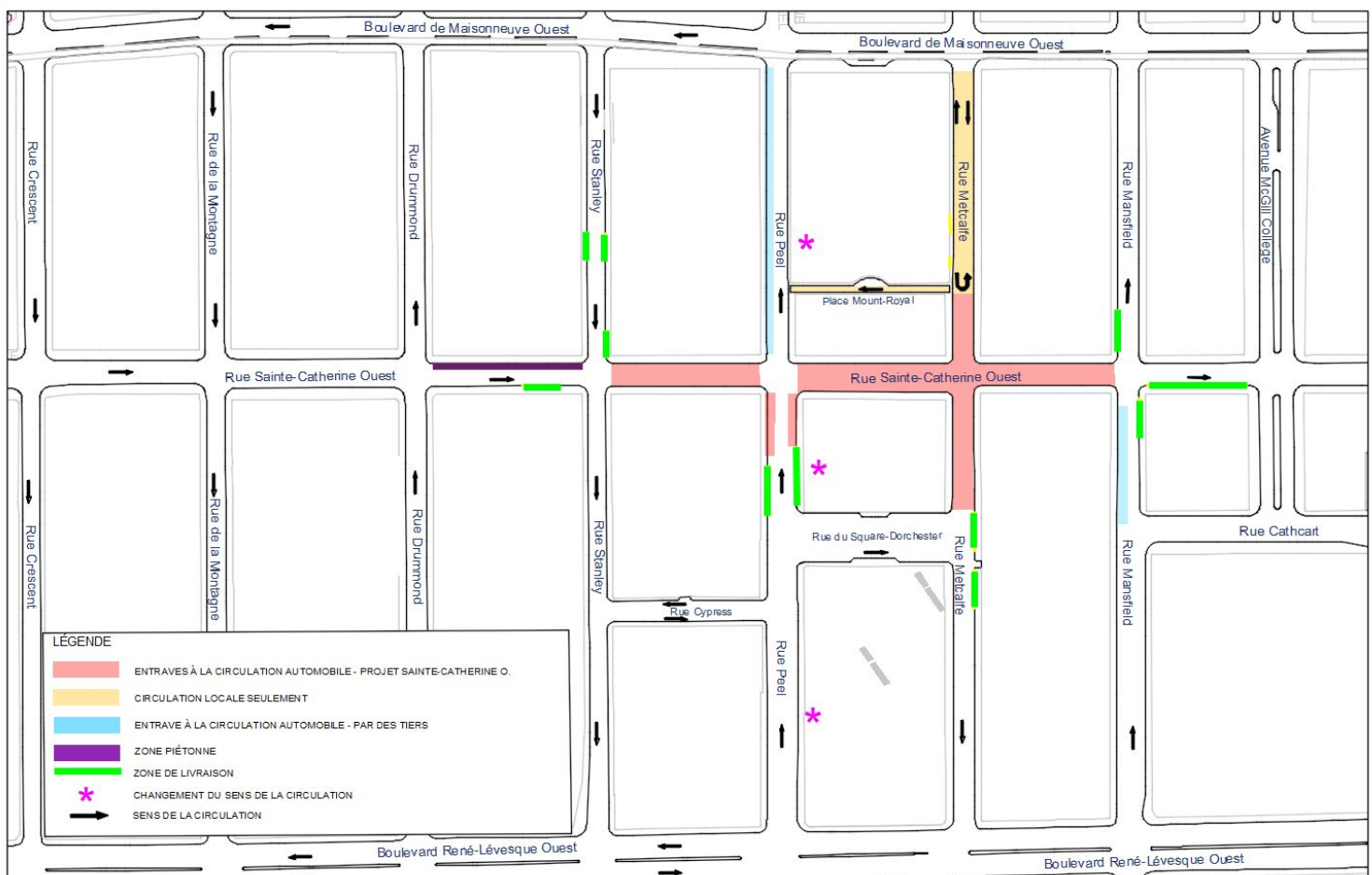

Underground infrastructure works and
redevelopment

Sainte-Catherine Ouest Project

The new phase of work will begin with archaeological excavations, important works of underground infrastructure replacement, more than centenarians and obsolete, and will be followed by surface redevelopment.

Traffic and parking

- Complete closure to traffic and parking on:
 - **Rue Sainte-Catherine O between Stanley and Peel** – Storage area
 - **Rue Sainte-Catherine O between Peel and Mansfield** – Work area (site)
 - **Rue Metcalfe between Place Mount-Royal and Dorchester Square** – Work area (site)
- **Partial restriction Rue Peel between Sainte-Catherine and Rue Dorchester Square** – Storage area
- Local traffic only:
 - **Rue Metcalfe between de Maisonneuve and Place Mount-Royal** - with no parking on the east side
 - **Place Mount-Royal between Metcalfe and Peel**
- **Rue Peel between René-Lévesque and de Maisonneuve** : will be made one-way towards the north.
- **Rue Sainte-Catherine O between Drummond and Stanley** : one traffic lane maintained and with no parking on the north side.
- Follow signs on site that indicate directions and detour paths.
- Nearby interior parking spaces remain accessible.

Mobility and active travel (pedestrians, public transport)

- Planned paths for pedestrian traffic, ensuring access to buildings at all times.
- Planned detours for STM bus routes and stops.

Garbage and recyclable

- Garbage and recyclable collection according to the usual schedule.
- Impacted sector: On collection days, place your garbage cans and bins, **well-identified with your address**, at the usual place. The containers that are not accessible to garbage collectors will be moved by the contractor.

Noise, dust and vibration

- The use of tools and other equipment may cause odors, dust, noise and vibrations.
- A special attention will be paid to work organisation so that the most noisy and disturbing operations be carried out at the most opportune time, in order to minimize disturbance of the population.

Work schedule

- Regular schedule: Monday to Saturday between 6:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.
- Works are authorized 7 days a week, 24 hours a day.
- The extended schedule will be used to minimize the impacts of the interventions during the day. For example, buildings water service connections (water and sewer) will be replaced at night. The works in front of the entrance of the buildings will be done outside of busy hours.
- Every year, during the work period, the site will be in winter break (towards the end of November to mid-February according to weather conditions) with re-opening of the streets impacted by the project to traffic.

Tree cutting

- The trees, in the site area, must be cut in view of their health state, of the fact that their survival is compromised by the works and that it is not possible to transplant them. A bigger number of trees will be planted in tree pits at the end of the work at the site, giving them better living conditions for their development. The cut trees will be reintegrated (upgraded) into urban environment in various forms.
